

Sensitisation of students and employees of the institution to the constitutional obligations: values, rights, duties and responsibilities.

Scottish Church College sincerely sensitises the students towards their responsibilities as citizens of India. The entry point age of the students is 18 years. Most of the freshers are new voters. The college provides them with a democratic environment where they can ask questions, debate and dialogue among themselves and with the faculty to develop an open-minded attitude, essential for becoming conscious citizens.

Every year the college organises flag-hoisting ceremony and other programmes on the Independence Day and Republic Day. All staff and students are encouraged to participate actively in these programmes. Speeches are delivered by senior faculty on those occasions, whereby the students learn the importance of constitutional obligations.



The college runs two courses: Political Science Core Course, and Political Science Generic Elective course, where about 100 students gather in-depth knowledge about the Constitution of the country.

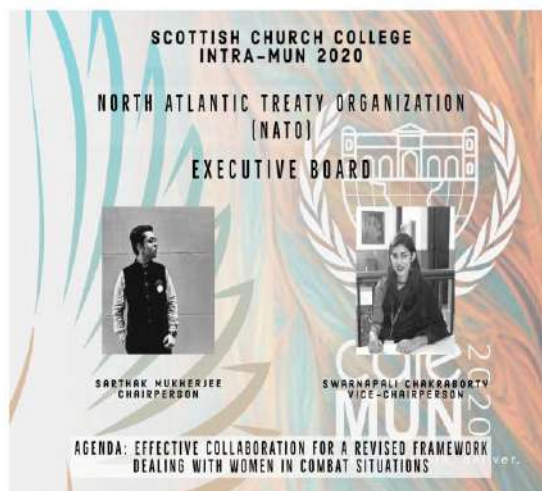
The students from different departments have regularly participated in the events like Mock Parliaments organised in different institutions. In 2018 The Debate Society, SCC organized a two days intra-college Mock United Nations titled Calemun2K18 with 26 participants on each day. The topic was 'Refugee Crisis in Middle East'. The first Inter-college Mock United Nations Competition, Calemun 2019, was held from 28.02.2019-1.03.19 with participants from all over Kolkata including, Presidency University, Jadavpur University, Loreto College and others. There were 91 participants. In 2019 two students of the department had taken part in the Mock Parliament held in St. Xavier's college. Intra College MUN was organised by the students of the Debate Society under the guidance of the Activity Clubs during the pandemic lockdowns. The entire competition was conducted virtually. Almost 30 students participated with much enthusiasm.

On May 24, 2019 the Department of Political Science organised group-based students' seminar on issues related to the Constitution of India, mainly on Constitutionalism.

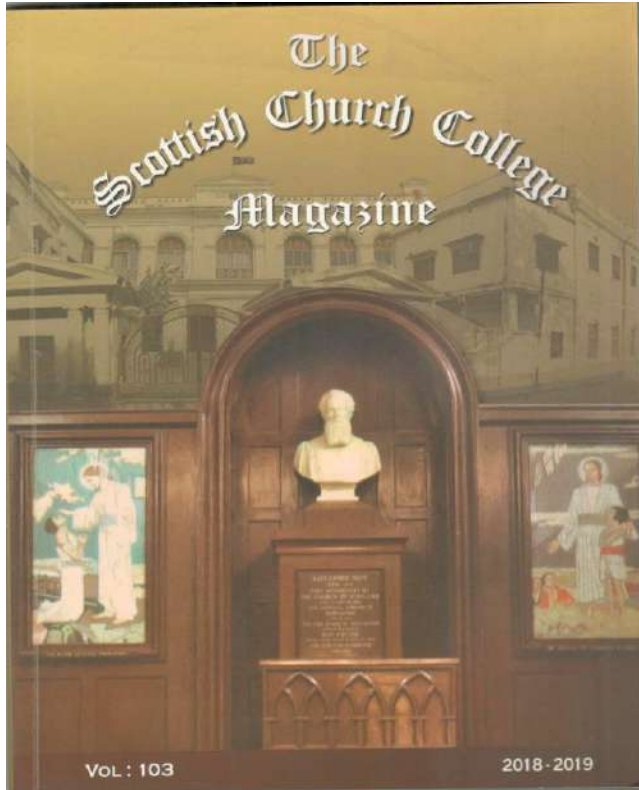


POLITICAL SCIENCE STUDENTS IN THE SEMINAR

Fundamental Duties of The Citizens Constitution of India

**Part - IV A
Fundamental Duties**

51 A. Fundamental duties - It shall be the duty of every citizen of India -

- (a) to abide by the constitution and respect its ideals and institutions, the National Flag and National Anthem;
- (b) to cherish and follow the noble ideals which inspired our national struggle for freedom;
- (c) to uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India;
- (d) to defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so;
- (e) to promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities; to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women;
- (f) to value and preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture;
- (g) to protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers and wild life, and to have compassion for living creatures;
- (h) to safeguard public property and to abjure violence;
- (i) to strive towards excellence in all spheres of individual and collective activity so that the nation constantly rises to higher levels of endeavour and achievement.

- This is to bring to your kind notice that, in order to maximise 18 - 19 age group enrolment in electoral roll & to ensure greater participation for a stronger democracy, all eligible (born on or before 01/01/1998) & un-enrolled students of your esteemed institution are required to register their names in the electoral roll of concerned polling stations where they voluntarily reside.
- In this enclosure, the Election Commission of India (ECI) in its letter vide No. 23/EK/2015 (first) dated 31/12/2015 (copy attached) has mandated all colleges to open special window in their institutions to survey & inform all such students in the application for registration.
- This special drive will be undertaken between 21/01/2016 & 29/01/2016.
- To achieve the objective, you are requested to appoint a Nodal Official, not below the rank of Asst. Professor, who will be responsible for smooth conduct of the programme. The name, designation & mobile no. of the official has to be intimated to the undersigned in Annexure A (attached) which will be collected from your college by our official on 19/01/2018. Nodal Officials shall attend an orientation programme on 19th or 20/01/2018 in the Office Chamber of the undersigned at Jesop Building, 2nd Floor, 63, Netaji Subhas Road, Kolkata.

Two election officials from our end will attend your institution during the specified period to provide support to the Nodal Official & supply self-declared forms. You are cordially requested to see to it that they are given a prominent place to sit in your campus.

5. The following method may be undertaken for smooth implementation of the programme -

- a) Nodal Official shall undertake a survey of the students in Annexure B & complete it by 25/01/16.
- b) Form 6 will be distributed to all those students who are still un-enrolled & along with a handbook explaining the method of filling the form & required supporting documents.
- c) Filled up Form 6 will be reviewed by our officials under proper receipt, if submitted within 29/01/2016, from students who are ordinary residents of any one of the assembly constituencies under Kolkata North Electoral District i.e. **152-Chowranga, 163-Faridpur, 164-Bidhulata, 165-Tarapur, 166-Singurpur, 167-Mandiata & 168-Kudpur/Delghata (RMC Ward No 1 to 59 & 62).** After the completion of the programme, the students have to come to Jesop Building, 2nd floor, 63, Netaji Subhas Road, Kolkata - 700 001 for submission of form.
- d) Un-enrolled students who are not ordinary residents of Kolkata North Electoral District may submit their Form 6 at the designated place/s of their respective assembly constituencies.
